
Many of the actions needed to respond to the climate emergency are in the hands of local authorities.



Councils can play a crucial role in building communities where people and nature thrive, with well insulated, affordable homes that are cheap and easy to heat, regular public transport, green spaces for all to enjoy, clean water to drink and clean air to breathe.

If you get time, tell candidates that means they need to:

**Deliver the Local Climate Action Plans**, by properly resourcing them and holding management to account for implementing them.

**Provide clean energy**, by prioritising renewable energy projects and upgrades to the electricity grid.

**Prioritise those at risk of energy poverty in all retrofitting programmes.**

Enforce energy efficiency improvements in the private rented properties, **so renters benefit from warmer homes too.**

**Reject further data centre developments given their long-term reliance on dirty fossil fuels.**

**Support international initiatives to end our dependence on dirty energy** including by supporting a future phase-out treaty.

**Ensure communities have access to green spaces.**

**Reduce our dependence on fossil fuel cars**, improve public transport and active travel infrastructure.

**Provide safe water to drink and clean air to breathe** by protecting and restoring our ecosystems, reducing the impact of agricultural and industrial activities across air, water, waste and noise.

# If you say one thing at the doorstep say you want **Faster and Fairer Climate Action**

If you get time, tell candidates  
that means they need to:

**Prioritise faster and fairer climate action by delivering a Climate Emergency Package to ramp up climate action before 2030.**

**Provide clean energy by building a 100% renewable energy system by 2040 with people and nature at its heart.**

**End our dependence on dirty fossil fuels by adopting phase-out dates for fossil fuels.**

**Ensuring warm homes for all** by rolling out European-wide programmes for **subsidised deep renovations prioritising those most at risk of energy poverty.**

Advocate for **financial support, for agroecological farming**, for fair prices for producers, while cutting support for the industrial model of production.

**Reduce air pollution and support clean public transport** by upgrading access to EU wide public transport, urgently reduce sale of fossil fuel cars.

**Support clean air by protecting, restoring and enhancing Europe's forests, soils and wetlands.**

**Ensure the EU leads by example for climate justice internationally.**
